Since 2022, the Delaware Arts Alliance (DAA) has been driving a groundbreaking research process to propel Delaware's creative economy and cultural tourism sector forward. The Creative Economy Advancement & Tourism Expansion (CREATE) Plan, an initiative led by the DAA, engages Delawareans in shaping a shared vision for a thriving, inclusive, and interconnected creative economy. This project—which is the first of its kind in the nation—delves into the full creative landscape at the state, county, and city levels. Developed with input from over 600 Delawareans from all walks of life, the CREATE Plan tackles post-pandemic challenges and provides actionable solutions to strengthen Delaware's creative economy.

What is the Creative Economy and Why is it Important?

The creative economy is a vibrant ecosystem—including arts nonprofits, for-profit creative businesses, and individual artists—dedicated to producing, sharing, and celebrating cultural, artistic, and heritage-related goods, as well as services and activities. This sector encompasses a wide range of participants, from entrepreneurs and designers to filmmakers and publishers. It also includes contributors like venues, event organizers, educators, and an essential network of regional suppliers, manufacturers, and retailers who all play key roles in sustaining and enriching the creative economy. Beyond its artistic value, the creative economy is a powerful economic driver that fuels innovation, research and development, tourism, and efforts in placemaking and branding.

Delaware's creative economy generated a whopping \$3.7 billion in output (the sales of goods and services) in 2021.

Every \$1 of output from the creative economy generates an additional \$0.60 of output in the broader Delaware economy.

This sector supports 18,500+ direct, indirect, and induced jobs - that's more than industries like wholesale trade and agriculture!

Over 70% of the creative economy is made up of small businesses and self-employed individuals.

The CREATE Plan goes beyond identifying challenges; it offers a roadmap to success. Informed by research and input from the community, the strategic plan provides **25 actionable recommendations**. The CREATE Plan's recommendations cover key areas, including:
